Reuse/Recycle (GFWC KY's Conservation State Project), Environmental Education, Beautification, Community Gardens, Care for Domesticated Animals, Energy Conservation, Air and Water Quality, Waste Handling, Tree Planting, Wildlife Protection, Outdoor Exploration, and Food Sources.

Your Club might want to be a part of GFWC's Nike "Reuse-A-Shoe Nike Grind" program, or Zappo's "Soles 4 Soles" program. Information on these projects can be found on their websites. Other ways to reuse or recycle can be found on websites: Green Tree Plastics for recycling plastic bottle caps, Best Buy and Staples for electronics recycling, Crazy Crayons for recycling crayons, H & M for taking old clothing for reuse or recycle, Crayola's "ColorCycle" for recycling dead markers, and Appalachian Wild, P.O. This includes government programs like Medicare, Medicaid, and private sources of pay. 


