Hello Ladies!

It's spring (almost). Have you got conservation projects planned out for the warmer weather? Any trees planted??

Here's a couple of things you may be interested in: Earth Day, 2017 and How to start a compost pile.

Earth Day this year is April 22. The theme for this year is "Environmental and Climate Literacy". Think of all the things this encompasses. We could do a lot with this theme! If you want ideas or more information on how you and your club can get involved go to earthday.org on the internet.

Benefits of Composting



How to Compost at Home

There are many different ways to make a compost pile; we have provided the following for general reference. Helpful tools include pitchforks, square-point shovels or machetes, and water hoses with a spray head. Regular mixing or turning of the compost and some water will help maintain the compost.

Backyard Composting

Select a dry, shady spot near a water source for your compost pile or bin.

Add brown and green materials as they are collected, making sure larger pieces are chopped or shredded.

Moisten dry materials as they are added.

Once your compost pile is established, mix grass clippings and green waste into the pile and bury fruit and vegetable waste under 10 inches of compost material.

Optional: Cover top of compost with a tarp to keep it moist. When the material at the bottom is dark and rich in color, your compost is ready to use. This usually takes anywhere between two months to two years.

Indoor Composting

How to Build a Worm Composting Bin

If you do not have space for an outdoor compost pile, you can compost materials indoors using a special type of bin, which you can buy at a local hardware store, gardening supplies store, or make yourself. Remember to tend your pile and keep track of what you throw in. A properly managed compost bin will not attract pests or rodents and will not smell bad. Your compost should be ready in two to five weeks.

The Hugh O'Brian Youth Leadership Organization "HOBY" is an international cooperating organization of the GFWC that develops and encourages young leaders to make positive changes to themselves, their communities, and ultimately, our global society. Every summer, HOBY Kentucky hosts a 4-day Leadership Seminar which brings together approximately 250 rising juniors from high schools across the state. During these four days, ambassadors are introduced to a four-part leadership model that touches on varying topics including self-efficacy, college and career decisions, diversity and inclusion, and setting realistic goals. The seminar ends with a charge to make a difference in their community by putting their leadership into action through service hours. All students are challenged to complete at least one hundred hours of community service over the course of one calendar year, and the results are powerful! Each year, the HOBY alumni from Kentucky alone provide approximately 25,000 hours of service across the state.

Housing, feeding, and providing the curriculum and necessary materials for these ambassadors from every corner of Kentucky is quite a task, and requires assistance from the community that will, in turn, be impacted by the work of these inspiring young people. HOBY Kentucky is a completely volunteer driven not-for-profit organization, as our profit is found in the positive difference our alumni make in their community, the state, and the world. This does mean that we rely solely on volunteers and donations of time, talent, goods, and funding.
