Hello GFWC Kentucky!



First I would like to give a very big welcome to the newly formed GFWC Kentucky Benton Juniorettes. I am so excited for this group of young women and look forward to what they will achieve.

I want to share some information to all clubs about starting a Juniorette Club in your area. What makes a Juniorette Club a club...if you have four members, you have a club that can start! Keep in mind, those four will recruit more members and hopefully the membership will keep going up.

Juniorette clubs are sponsored by a Woman's Club, Junior Woman's Club, or their districts or State Federations. It is recommended that a Juniorette club not be organized unless there is a regular GFWC advisor from a Woman's Club or Junior Woman's Club assigned to it. For further guidelines on organizing a GFWC Juniorette club, please refer to the GFWC Juniorette Handbook at www.gfwc.org or contact me at any time for questions or concerns.

Juniorette Clubs, are composed of young women in junior or senior high school with an age range from 12 to 18 years. These clubs can be grades 6-12 or if you want to separate them you can do 6-8 for Middle School and 9-12 for High School. Juniorettes may have voting privileges at the GFWC Annual Convention, are eligible for awards, and have reporting responsibilities, just like Woman's Clubs and Junior Woman's Clubs. These members can set their club dues to anything above \$10.00; they pay \$10.00 per year in dues to GFWC anything above that would be funds for the club.

Other possibilities would be a Single Issues or Cyber Club. The Single Issues club can choose to focus on one of the Community Service Programs or Signature Projects. They are active membership clubs with appropriate voting privileges. The Cyber Club could work for the tech savvy middle and high school students who are busy with school activities; however they can "attend" meetings conducted through email, Facebook, Twitter, or other social media outlets that all members agree upon. Cyber clubs are active membership clubs with appropriate voting privileges.

This is a great opportunity for young women to grow into great leaders. They can participate in meaningful volunteer community service, have wonderful new friendships and networking opportunities around the state and country. It will also give them access to and support from leadership at all levels of Federation and the prestige of belonging to one of the world's oldest and largest service organizations.
