Anywhere in the state, another state so the snowbirds can stay active when members fly south for the winter. Club projects are individual things that members can do anywhere.

Now with ZOOM in existence, meetings can be fun to see each other on the computer. Do not say you can’t learn to ZOOM! We have a 100 year old member who can ZOOM!

A nice thing about Cyber Clubs is Cyber membership in your club. If you had a member move, and she misses you and you miss her, she can still be a member of your club. ZOOM her in to your meeting. There is a club in Ohio that has 40 members. Twenty of them live in one city and meet each month and the other 20 live all over the country. One member lives in Arizona.
