Synopsis of a Creativity Award Recipient

GFWC-KY Bluegrass Junior Woman's Club

Great Pumpkin Book Contest: Club members hosted this program for school children and their families to enhance literacy at the Arlington Elementary school. Families were encouraged to read books, write book reports, and create pumpkin-themed art together as part of the school-wide literacy program.



The contest consisted of children choosing a favorite book to read with their parents. Next, they had to choose a favorite character in the story and illustrate the character by drawing and decorating it on a real or plastic pumpkin. Then the child and their parents answered some pre-determined questions as part of a book report. Questions included: the title of the book, its author, and the name of the character the child chose to focus on. The children were also asked to provide a description of their character,

describe some of the things the character did in the story, and tell why they either did or did not like the character. To help round out their book reports, the children answered some additional questions such as the setting of the story, the main problem that the character worked through in the story, and the creative solution that the character created to solve the problem. Completed book reports and pumpkins were dropped off at the school library for judging on October 27th and they were on display to the public for the annual Book Fair family night at the school. Winners were announced for first, second, and third place and some honorable mentions for K-1 grades, 2-3 grades, and 4-5 grades and each child received a certificate for their participation.

This project has all the elements of an excellent literacy project and it involves the whole family! By having the different activities, children and parents are able to share the love of reading, reading comprehension skills, and having fun creating an artistic expression of one of the characters in the book—all of which will make this a very memorable learning experience that everyone will remember for years to come.

Bluegrass Junior Woman's Club members spent 5 hours planning, judging, and creating the certificates for this event and also donated \$20 toward necessary supplies for this project.

GFWC Club Creativity Award- 2022

The project selected as the Club Creativity Award Winner from our state take the community connections initiative to the top level keeping the community informed on Women in history. It gives an insight to the community how vital "Women's History" has evolved over the last 100 years.

This local Woman's Club keeps their community involved and updated on the history of famous women in their community as well as state wide. The "Barbie Doll Collection" is one way the club does just that! The dolls fashioned to look and portray the period of time when the woman they portray lived. They are dressed in clothes, shoes and accessories of that time period the women lived.

These "Barbie Dolls" were donated and now belong to their county library. The dolls were created when this club celebrated the 100 anniversary of "Women's" rights.

One club member brought them to their March meeting in 2022, the dolls were put on display and the club member presented a program about the dolls, who they represented, the time period and discussed what made them famous in history. Three Lexington Kentucky women were discussed in detail and how they were very famous Kentucky women. The Kentucky women were Mary Barr Clay , who was Vice President of the American Women's Suffrage Association. She started a club in Lexington. Laura Clay formed a speakers bureau to talk to Women's Clubs and Civic Organizations and Madeline McDowell Breckinridge wrote for the Lexington Herald Leader newspaper. She wrote on Women's Rights and also lobbied in Frankfort, Kentucky at the state capital and for the passage of the Women's Rights bill.

The club plans to continue these Barbie Doll collection to include more famous women. Two club members are right now collecting, doing research and gathering articles of famous women to further the Barbie Doll collection.

The dolls that they already have are on display for their community and for visitors who visit their county library. They encourage everyone to go and see the display of these famous women of Kentucky and other women throughout history.

GFWC KY Legislation Public Policy Creativity Award Winner - 2022

Morgan County Woman's Club takes advantage of their club meeting to sign members up during a club meeting. Members have contacted their appropriate national representatives in regard to legislative issues such as human trafficking and domestic violence and have received personal responses from some of them! Those responses have been forwarded to GFWC. Clubwomen contacted their elected government officials' offices in DC and in district asking for continued federal funding of global health programs that provide vaccinations. Members signed an online petition to members of Congress encouraging support of continued funding for childhood vaccine programs. The campaign was "Advocate to Vaccinate," and it was focused on the eradication of polio around the world. They wrote letters, sent emails, and made phone calls. Hopefully, our government officials are now aware of these important issues that are of great concern to their constituents in eastern Kentucky!
