6)Register to attend the Children's Advocacy Week Virtual Prep Session on Wednesday, February 26th at 12:00 PM ET as we discuss how to make the most of the advocacy week and updates on key policies to discuss with legislators

7) Check out the 2024 Kentucky KIDS COUNT Data Book and County Data Dashboard to see how kids are faring across Kentucky and in your county

Water and non-perishable food for several days Extra cell phone battery or charger Battery-powered or hand crank radio that can receive NOAA Weather Radio tone alerts and extra batteries Flashlight and extra batteries **First aid kit** Whistle to signal for help Dust mask, to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation Non-sparking wrench or pliers to turn off utilities Can opener (if kit contains canned food) Local maps

# The GFWC Barbourville Woman's Study Club Donates to Dance Blue in honor of Charley Greene Dixon

The Barbourville Woman's Study Club recently made a heartfelt donation to Dance Blue, a University of Kentucky organization dedicated to fighting pediatric cancer, in honor of Charley Greene Dixon, a beloved community pillar who passed away from colon cancer. This touching tribute highlights the enduring legacy of Dixon and the community's commitment to support vital causes.

Half of the funds for the donation were raised during the October Knox Street Thunder Car Show in Barbourville, which brought together community members in a display of support and camaraderie. Proceeds from the event were matched by the Woman's Study Club, doubling the impact of the community's efforts.

Charley Greene Dixon was a shining light in our community, always willing to lend a hand and inspire others," said Claudia Greenwood a spokesperson for the Woman's Study Club. This donation is a way for us to honor his memory and contribute to a cause he would deeply care about."

# PRESS/SOCIAL MEDIA BOOK CONTEST

Press/Social Media Book entries must be brought to the GFWC Kentucky Annual State Convention. If a club is not attending the convention, arrangements can be made to have the book brought by another attendee or can still be mailed to the Press/Social Media Contest Chairman. All books will be returned to the clubs during the convention. No books will be mailed back to a club unless arrangements have been made prior to February 1<sup>st</sup> with the Contest Chairman.

Press/Social Media Books will be judged according to the club paid membership size; small,medium,large.

PRESS/SOCIAL MEDIA BOOK CONTEST RULES:

- 1. Dates of publicity shall be from January 1-December 31 of the contest year.
- 2. Only one volume can be submitted with the binding cover being a three inch (3") three-ring notebook maximum.
- 3. The paper used withing the notebook should be 8.5x11"
- 4. Book Cover must include:
  - a. Name of club along with city or town clearly lettered on front cover
  - b. No artwork permitted (on front cover or anywhere in the book)
- 5. First Page of book must include
  - a. Name of Club
  - b. District the club is located in
  - c. Number of paid club members
  - d. Name of city or town
  - e. Name of Club President
  - f. Name of Press/Social Media Book contact person
- 6. Second Page
  - a. Name of all newspapers, magazines, and/or electronic media sources in which club publicity appears (including social media)
  - b. Article clippings may be collected from printed newspapers and magazines as well as online publications (including social media)
- 7. Publicity must be
  - a. From January 1 thru December 31 of the contest year
  - b. Only articles covering events in which club actually participated and in which the name of the club appears, with the name of the club being underlined by using a ruler – no free hand.
  - c. Identified the name of the newspaper and the date on which the article was published must be under each article clipping or book will be

disqualified. This can be hand printed, typed or cut out from the source. **This requirement is very important to the judging process**. The masthead or the front page name of the newspaper is not to be used for identification.

- d. If an article is from an electronic media source (including social media), the name of the electronic media source and the date on which the article appeared must be under each article or book will be disqualified.
- e. Only photographs that have appeared in newspapers or electronic media sources (including social media) can be used no original photographs.
- f. Presented in chronological order or present by Community Service area in chronological order.
- 8. Pages should be
  - a. Articles or clipping centered on each page. Include as many articles as desired on each page. Colored paper may be used behind article clippings but is not required.
  - b. NO artwork is permitted.
- 9. Check List for Press/Social Media Book should be completed and taped to the inside back cover.
- 10. Mailing arrangements must be made in advance with the Press/Social Media Chairman. Book must be postmarked and mailed on or before February 1. Club is responsible for cost of mailing as well as return mailing should they be unable to bring to convention.

#### JUDGING CRITERIA

Whether article clippings covered events in which club actually participated.

Whether newspaper or electronic media source's style of reporting was factual, to the point, and easily understood.

Whether all contest rules were followed

#### AWARDS

Certificates will be presented to the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place winners in each membership category during the GFWC Kentucky Annual Convention.

Press/Social Media Books will be on exhibit during the GFWC KY Annual Convention
